

Rector's Message

Towards establishing the Kingdom of God.... slowly, silently...but surely

The theme of Strenna 2023, "AS THE YEAST IN TODAY'S HUMAN FAMILY- THE LAY DIMENSION IN THE FAMILY OF DON BOSCO"

reflects one of the foundational principles of the Salesian Family, going back to Don Bosco's work with the young. This theme is addressed to two target groups: one comprised of young children, adolescents and older youth, while the other includes all the groups of the Salesian Family, who are invited to discover or rediscover their own *lay*



dimension. There is an exhortation to be "leaven in the dough of the bread of humanity." Drawn from the parable of Luke's Gospel, this has great educational significance as it emphasizes that leaven is "the only living ingredient," that, when used in small quantities, "has the ability to influence, condition, and transform the whole portion of dough", making it double or triple in size. It is a symbol of fruitfulness and growth of the Kingdom of God. Even with limited resources, the House of God can be built, where filial connection to love and faith in God, mutual trust, fraternity and joy, become the fertile ground for a community that can never stop growing.

In the wake of the unprecedented violence in Manipur going on since May 3rd this year up to date. the concomitant experience of pain, slaughter, arson, isolation, tragedies, sufferings and injustices, let us as educators, take our young through a journey from becoming conscious, aware of the sufferings of our fellow human beings, form despair to hope, towards openness and solidarity, as students the necessity is not just to be aware

There are so many means to reach out, in making others aware, having our own peace marches, social media is growing astronomically and influencing people across age groups, lets awaken, to encourage the young to an ew horizons in influencing and being conspicuous of our and sisters suffering. Preparing Lay Leaders in the Salesian Charism

Province of St. Francis Xavier Bombay- INB – A Diploma Course for Lay Salesians.....



A Diploma Course for Lay Salesians commenced on July 15, 2023 at the Don Bosco Youth Centre, Koregaon Park, Pune. The team headed by Fr. Ian Doulton, Sr Teresa Joseph, Fr Vivian D'Souza and Fr Valerian Pereira put this programme together. This

module will conclude on Sunday 23. For this first attempt there are 16 participants, from six of our Salesian Institutions around the province.

This, first ever course if its kind offered to those holding leadership positions in some of our most iconic institutions.

The inaugural session began in the AV Hall of the Salesian Catechetical Centre with Fr Savio Silveira, Provincial (INB) unveiling the picture of Mamma Margaret the first lay Salesian (by Edoardo La Francesca).



Don Bosco, we know, had many teachers, and what was more, he admired them immensely, but none did he revere more than his dear mother – Margaret Occhiena, affectionately known then and now as *Mamma Margaret*. She played a seminal in the life of John and that of his boys.

Opening this session was a Power Point on the sayings of Don Bosco on the Role of Mary in his life, the life of his boys and that of the Congregation and this was followed by Fr. Ian Doulton welcomed everyone and made it clear that this is the first ever course of its kind. Then followed a Power Point presentation on the life and legacy of Mamma Margaret



Interestingly, Fr. Savio Silveira's intervention touched upon the why and the how of the Diploma Course for Lay Salesians in the Spirituality, Charism, and Pedagogy of Don Bosco. He asked: "Why this course? Let this question linger..." said Fr Savio, as he went on to emphasize, "Our Mission is

that we are called to be signs and bearers of God's love for the young." Then he went on to state: "This programme will not be just for this province. We want to make it available to Salesian India," said Fr. Silveira.

The programme concluded with the special prayer prepared for the occasion and it was prayed by all the participants bringing the inaugural session to an apt conclusion.

The methodology adopted for this course includes both theoretical and practical sessions showcasing the Salesian Educational System, the Preventive System, the Rector Major's Strenna for 2023 and an appropriate exposé on understanding Teenagers. Testimonies from each of the participants, a virtual guided pilgrimage to Becchi, Castelnuovo and surroundings, Lines of action for today and how the preventive system is to be lived as a spirituality in our institutions, our homes and in our lives.

It is hoped that this Lay Salesian Programme becomes leaven in Salesian India to enthuse many lay members, who work "shoulder to shoulder" with the Salesians to enjoy the Salesian Vocation in a new and more effective manner in all their settings.

Salesian Spirituality (a blend of life and action) is strongly connected to two unique historical figures- St. France

de Sales and St. John Bosco. The Salesian of Don Bosco (SDB) is a religious congregation of men in Catholic Church founded in 1869 by John Bosco and named after St. Francis, with the main objective of helping the poor and migrant youngsters during the Industrial Revolution. The symbol, Salesian Coat of Arms consists of a shining star, the large anchor and the heart on fire symbolizing the theological virtues of Faith. Hope and Charity. The Salesians' charter describes the society's mission as "the Christian perfection of its associates obtained by the exercise of spiritual and corporal works of charity towards the young, especially the poor, and the education of boys to the priesthood" The two main objectives the organization are Evangelization of the poor and building the church. The organization is headed by the Rector Major and the society's general council. Since 2014, the Rector Major of the Salesians is The Reverent Verv Father Angel Fernandez Artime.

At the core of this organization lies education and evangelization- the first and principal beneficiaries being the young, especially the poorest of them – looking for their social and

economic upliftment by opening orphanages, the young workers and preparing for work and those apostolic vocations. In addition, the organization puts an emphasis on loving kindness, optimism and joy, creativity and flexibility, pastoral charity – the source of which is the very heart of Christ. 



Don Bosco school has always focused on all round development and importance of participation right from the lower classes up to the
