What did you learn?

help prevent accidents and encourage our students to be more mindful and responsible citizens.

How will you apply it with students in the classroom/beyond?

The learning from the seminar will be integrated into classroom discussions and activities related to civic responsibility. We can also organize follow-up workshops and role-playing activities where students can practice the safety measures discussed. Additionally, a school-wide campaign promoting road safety, with posters and presentations, can further reinforce these critical lessons.

What could have been better?

While the session was informative and engaging, the use of Marathi as the primary language posed a challenge for some students who were not fluent in it. Providing translations or offering the seminar in both Marathi and English would have ensured that all students could fully grasp the content.

What was done well?

Mr. Vinay More's engaging presentation style and the interactive nature of the session were particularly effective. The use of real-life examples and scenarios made the concepts more relatable for the students. Additionally, rewarding students with a takeaway book for their participation created a positive reinforcement for active engagement.
