What did you learn?

How will you apply it with students in the classroom/beyond?

discussions, and project work. Encouraging students to be eco-ambassadors both at school and in their local communities.

What could have been better?

Wider communication prior to the drive might have enabled even more students and families to participate.

Organizing themed workshops or talks alongside the drive could deepen students' understanding of e-waste and plastic hazards.

What was done well?

Outstanding participation across all classes and stages, with enthusiastic involvement from teachers and neighbourhood societies.

Efficient coordination ensured proper collection and safe disposal of e-waste and plastics.

The competitive element, with digital certificates and a class trophy, motivated maximum engagement.

Do you have any suggestions?

Introduce recurring collection days throughout the year.

Partner with more community organizations for greater outreach.

Include awareness campaigns using posters, assemblies, and student-led presentations.
